Notice of Race (NoR) V 1.2

Changes are noted by a vertical line in the right margin.

The notation '[DP]' in a rule of the sailing instructions (SIs) means that a penalty for the breach of the rule may, at the discretion of the protest committee, be less than disqualification. This changes RRS 60.1(a).

The notation '[NP]' in a rule of the sailing instructions (SIs) means that a boat may not protest another boat for breaking that rule. This changes RRS 60.1(a).

1 RULES

- 1.1 The event is governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*.

2 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 2.1 The sailing instructions will be available after 1700 hrs on Saturday, August 28, 2021 - online at: <https://hyannis yachtclub.org/oceanclass> or at the Waterfront Office.

3 COMMUNICATION

- 3.1 The official notice board is located at the southwest corner of the HYC patio.
- 3.2 All boats shall carry a VHF radio capable of communicating on Channels 9, 16, 68 and 69.
- 3.3 On the water, the race committee will communicate with competitors on VHF channel 68.
- 3.4 While racing, except in an emergency, a boat shall not make voice or

data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats.

4 **ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY**

4.1 All skippers shall be current members of US Sailing.

4.2 The event is open to all PHRF boats over 24 feet (LOA) and have a valid 2021 PHRF New England certificate.

4.3 [NP] All boats shall minimally comply with the US Nearshore section of the US Sailing Safety Equipment Requirements (USSER) (<https://www.ussailing.org/competition/offshore/safety-information/ser-world-sailing-special-regulations/>).

4.4 Classes are defined as follows:

Class A - Spinnaker	PHRF	All ratings
Class B - Non-Spinnaker	PHRF	Based on registration
Class C - Non-Spinnaker	PHRF	Based on registration

4.5 Eligible boats may enter by completing the online entry form at <https://hyannis yachtclub.org/oceanclass> Early registration is requested.

4.6 To be considered an entry in the event, a boat shall complete all registration requirements and pay all fees.

4.7 A minimum of three boats must be registered to create a class.

4.8 As a condition of entry, each owner, skipper, and participating crew member agrees to comply with all current Federal, State, County, and Hyannis Yacht Club COVID guidelines.

5 **FEES**

5.1 Entry fees are as follows:

6 **SCHEDULE**

6.1 Registration:

7 **VENUE**

7.1 Racing shall take place on Nantucket Sound.

7.2 Starting area shall be approximately ½ mile southwest of Hyannis Port Breakwater and west of buoy "HH".

8 **COURSES**

8.1 The course(s) to be sailed will be as follows: Windward/leeward, triangle, windward/leeward/triangle or any combination of drop marks and government marks. Details are in SIs Attachment "A".

8.2 The marks that may be used are government marks and colored inflatable drop marks.

8.3 Course length will be approximately 7 to 12 miles.

9 **PENALTY SYSTEM**

9.1 RRS 44.1 is changed so that the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by the One-Turn Penalty.

10 **SCORING**

10.1 Two races are required to be completed to constitute the series.

10.2 RRS 5.3 will apply.

11 **BERTHING**

11.1 HYC shall attempt to provide free guest moorings for any vessel registered for a race covered by this NOR. Contact Dockmaster Bob Rogers at dockmaster@hyannis yachtclub.org.

12 **RISK STATEMENT**

12.1 RRS 3 states: 'The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue to race is hers alone.' By participating in this event each competitor agrees and acknowledges that sailing is a potentially dangerous activity with inherent risks. These risks include strong winds and rough seas, sudden changes in weather, failure of equipment, boat handling errors, poor seamanship by other boats, loss of balance on an unstable platform and fatigue resulting in increased risk of injury.
Inherent in the sport of sailing is the risk of permanent, catastrophic injury or death by drowning, trauma, hypothermia or other causes.

13 **PRIZES**

13.1 Prizes will be given in each class as follows:

3 boats in a Class: 1st place
4-5 boats in class: 1 st & 2 nd place
6 or more boats in class 1 st , 2 nd and 3 rd place
